Time: Thursday, August 23, 2018 from 10:30am to 3:00pm

Place: Minamata Moyai Naoshi Center (Moyai Kan)

Participants: International students, etc.

Program: Ice breaker, presentation by Minamata HS students, lunch and chatting, tour of Minamata's famous spots (guided in English by Minamata HS students!)

Capacity: About 45 (if over capacity, participants from Minamata partner universities (Kumamoto University, Prefectural University of Kumamoto and Sojo University) will be given preference. Other participants will be chosen by lottery). Other participants on the day include Minamata HS and local junior high school students.

<All About Minamata>

Minamata City is located at the southern edge of Kumamoto Prefecture, bordering Kagoshima. The city's area is 162 km² and the population is 25,000. Nestled in the middle of beautiful seas, mountains, and rivers, the blessings of nature can be found anywhere in Minamata.

Seas: Minamata is known for its rugged coastlines that face the beautiful Yatsushiro Sea, known as the Mediterranean of Kyushu.

Mountains: The surrounding mountains are lush with forests and clear water. Away from large cities, the pace of life is peaceful and calm.

Onsen: Minamata is home to Yunotsuru Onsen, where visitors enjoy green mountain views and a babbling stream; and Yunoko Onsen, which looks out over the Yatsushiro Sea, dotted with distant islands.

Flowers: Visitors to Eco Park Minamata can enjoy 4,000 roses of 600 varieties. The line of cherry trees stretching five kilometers along the seaside and the cosmos of Nakaoyama Park also cannot be missed.

Specialities: In Minamata you can find citrus fruits known as dekopon and amanatsu; sweet salad onions that are tasty even raw; green and black tea of a wide variety of flavors and aromas; rich seafood including cutlass fish, *shirasu* sardine fry, and oysters; and shochu made from sweet potatoes and rice grown here in Minamata.

Food: We recommend trying Minamata's original champon, fresh fish caught in the Yatsushiro Sea, and sweets made from local fruits such as dekopon.

Environment: Minamata City is using the experience of the pollution-caused Minamata disease as a lesson, and is now working hard to protect nature and provide safety and security in citizens' daily lives as well as in local industries. City policy embraces the environment, and the city is promoting itself worldwide as an environmental city that other municipalities can look to as a model.
